In addition, differences among how departments value and judge different types of publications for promotion and tenure will round out the discussion. With over 30 years of publishing experience, and the acquisition of over 400 archaeology/ethnohistory volumes, Dr. Knight is truly a leader in the field of archaeological publication.
